## Dolton C of E Curriculum History Update 27.1.25





In **Lions Class** this half term we have finished our learning on prehistoric Britain by looking at the change from the Bronze Age to the Iron Age. The children have also summarised their learning from across all three periods of prehistory to show the similarities, differences and advances in technology from all three periods.

The rest of this half term we will be exploring the Romans and their impact upon Britain including who they were, where they came from and the type of culture they were.

Little Otters have been learning to understand the world around them using the theme of Traditional Tales. By exploring stories through ou play and activities the children can develop their imagination and language skills whilst learning about different cultures and values. We have been thinking about the decisions our characters make and whether these are good or bad - being critical thinkers will support our learning in the future.

## History at Dolton...

One of our curriculum drivers for this half term is History. We have all been delving into the past reflecting on our learning so far and being critical thinkers about our focus historical periods. This term the children will be investigating different time periods and the lives of people living in them.



In **Tigers Class** this half term we are exploring significant individuals; Mary Anning and Sir David Attenborough. The children have already began to explore the life of Mary Anning, finding out about the fossil discoveries that she made and the inequality of women at the time. We will explore the life and works of David Attenborough over the next few weeks and compare the two people.
