Academic (Wisdom, Knowledge and Skills)

- As speakers, readers and writers we will be writing third person narrative stories, which will build on a previous unit taught in the autumn. Then we will be focussing on writing formal letters to complain. In guided reading Years 3 and 4 will be exploring a book called Dancing Bear by Michael Morpurgo. Years 5 and 6 will be analysing The Explorer. Children are encouraged to read at home regularly and quiz on their AR books in school.
- As religious and worldview explorers, all children will be studying Hinduism. Year 3 and 4 will be exploring the question: What does it mean to be Hindu in Britain today? Whilst Year 5 and 6 will be answering the question: Why do Hindus want to be good?
- As mathematicians in Year 3-4, we will begin by exploring mass and capacity, then revisit fractions before finishing on a unit of time. In Year 5 and 6, we will be learning about the link between fractions, decimals and percentages. Next we will explore shape until the end of the half term. Year 6 will also be preparing and completing their SATs during this term.
- As scientists, Years 3 and 4 are learning about states of matter with lots of learning around solids, liquids and gases. Years 5 and 6 are exploring Space. Children will consolidate their knowledge of planets and bodies in the Solar System and begin to make deductions around what makes each planet unique.
- As historians, we will be continuing with our work on the Romans but focussing much more on how they affected Britain and what their lasting effects were on the country.
- As physically active learners, we are lucky to have Lottie from Atlantic Racquet Centre coming in to teach us Tennis.
- As computer scientists, we will be creating 3D models using a program called TinkerCAD.

Innovation

- We will develop our computing skills by creating 3D models using computer programs.
